He is the author of more than 70 books for children and adults. The best selling *Keepers of the Earth: Native American Stories and Environmental Activities for Children* and others of his "Keepers" series is a remarkable integration of science and folklore. John has worked with educators and Native elders from around the world to design a series of teachings which connect individuals directly to the natural world. His programs of natural and cultural awareness include a wide range of skills from traditional tracking and survival skills to music, storytelling, dance, peacemaking and martial arts training. The name Arts of Life\* was chosen to describe these programs, which emphasize indigenous knowledge, the lessons of Nature and the power of art.
