Being aware of the daily inequalities that women face, as well as the deep misunderstanding of the sacred feminine that we see in the world at this moment, **The Tracking Project** has been working to empower women through our curriculum since the organization’s inception in 1986. The first **Dreamtracking** camp for young women took place in 1996 and has continued to take place in northern New Mexico every July since that time.

During the week self-empowerment, self-awareness, and a connection to Mother Nature are fostered through physical practices like fire making, archery, camouflage, silent movement, conscious running and self-defense techniques. These teachings are blended with mental and spiritual practices like meditation, dreaming, moon knowledge, herbology, art, storytelling, stargazing, humor and music.

The world is evolving and we are evolving with it. In the past, **Dreamtracking** was an experience for younger women ages 12-18, but recently we have noticed that our teachings are particularly valuable to women ages 16-30, and so we are now offering higher levels of the teachings to this age group.

Come and join a beautiful community of women in the breathtaking environment of the high desert southwest. Develop your sense of adventure, freedom and confidence in a safe and fun environment.

### *Dreamtracking – General Information*

**The Tracking Project** accepts names of interested young girls throughout the year and these names are taken down in the order that they come in. Campers who attended the previous year are given first chance to return. Their decision must reach our office by **March 27**. Then we begin to call the other applicants, filling the remaining spots until we have 30 campers. This process allows us to take our campers as far as they would like to go in terms of skills, knowing that they can come back year after year.

If you are informed that you have been accepted for the camp, you will receive a link to an on-line registration form and you will be asked to make a payment of \$325 (deposit) or \$650 (full tuition) plus a non-refundable registration fee of \$35 by May 20. **The balance is due by June 17.**

#### Travel

Dreamtracking will take place in a high country meadow on the Circle A Ranch in the Jemez Mountains near Cuba, New Mexico. **The camp officially begins at 5:00 p.m. on July 25. Camp ends on the morning of August 1.**



Campers arriving by car should plan to arrive on Saturday, July 25 at the Circle A Ranch between 1 and 4 p.m. They should be picked up at the same place between 10:30 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. on Saturday, August 1. **Please be prompt!**

Campers arriving by air should arrive at the Albuquerque Sunport on Saturday, July 25 between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. They should depart Albuquerque Sunport on Saturday, August 1 between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. Our travel agent — Terry Williams-Keffer — will help you coordinate your arrival and departure times to coincide with our van pick-ups. **Because of time restraints, it is important that everyone adhere to these times.**
